Math: Measuring length using the metric and imperial systems.

Creation Studies: We have our Country Presentations on Wednesday and Thursday, followed by a new unit, Our Changing Roles and Responsibilities. Please send completed Country Project into school on Monday.

Spelling: Students will be doing Lesson 19. The students will be working on words with "sh" and "th". The spelling words are shout, shut, crash, then, thin, math, think, together, nothing, anything, shell, gather, shape, shore, and thick. The Spelling test will be on Friday.

Reading: For Reading, students will be working on comparing and contrasting two similar fictional stories.

Writing: For Writing, students will be working on writing a recount of an event. Students will choose a personal event that they would like to write about.

Math: Next week, students will begin learning about geometry. Students will learn about polygons, and about regular and irregular shapes.

Science: For Science, students will begin learning about water in the environment. Students will identify different states of water in various environments during different times of the year.

Bible: For Bible, we will move on to our next question, "Who is Jesus?". Students will be learning about when Jesus turns water into wine. The memory verse for next week is found in Hebrews 13:8. "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever." The students will recite their memory verse on Friday.

Bible Studies:

For six weeks, since the new year began here at KCA, the children and I have been looking at how animals are spoken of in the Bible. Stories about animals are woven through the Bible. They serve as good teachers so that we can hear God's Word in ways that help us understand His wishes and expectations of us.

We have already learned about ants, eagles and lions. There are three other animals that we will look at in this unit.

Ant - We learned that God is calling us to be like ants who are diligent, industrious, and wise in preparing even though they are small.

Eagle - This is our symbol at KCA and our memory verse was the one on our front wall at the school. We learned that trusting in our Lord makes anything possible.

Lions - This was a tricky one! God refers to himself as a lion whose roar calls us to follow him. Also, the devil can be like a sneaky lion trying to prey on us. We talked about how prayer and His word help us recognize God and that our hearts tell us when we are making good and Godly decisions.

Fish - We will be learning that God calls us to bring others to Him. We are "fishers of men." We will brainstorm together ways that we can do that.

Spider - We will be learning about how, even though we really work hard at something or really want something, God has a plan for us. It is important that we place our trust in Him.

Sheep - We will end the unit learning that Jesus is our shepherd and He wants us close to Him. We can do that through prayer, through reading the Word, and through attending church and communing with other Christians.

Greetings Parents and Students of Grade 6,

Though we were not able to go skiing this past Tuesday, we are making plans to go again on Thursday, February 13.

Here is what we hope to achieve this coming week:

<u>Spelling</u>: Week 19 Spelling List: coward, drowsily, bough, endow, mouthful, compound, pronoun, household, downstream, discount, surrounding, pronounced, foundation, resounding, lounge, announce, account, counterpart, outrageous, drought <u>Test on Friday</u>

<u>Memory Verse</u>: "The man of integrity walks securely, but he who takes crooked paths will be found out." Proverbs 10:9

Reading: We will be finishing off Hatchet this week. Our focus for February will be on Poetry.

Writing: We will be working with cause and effect paragraphs.

<u>Bible</u>: Our current unit is on Pentecost. Our stories will include Philip and the Ethiopian, Conversion of Saul, Peter's Vision, and Peter Escape from Jail.

Math: We started a new unit on Probability.

<u>Social Studies:</u> We have been spending time learning about residential schools, the Indian Act, and a number of treaties. This week we will explore aboriginal veterans' monuments, the group of seven, and Haudenosaunee Confederacy.

There is a lot going on in the next few weeks with tests, projects, and exams. Students are reminded to use their class time effectively and study and practice at home. Here's what we are up to next week:

- Math: We will be starting our next unit on measurement 2D and 3D shapes. We will also begin to review what we have learned this year to prepare for the Math Exam on February 7. The review package is due the morning of the 7th.
- Language: We have finished our fairytale perspective stories. We will be moving on to speeches.
 Details about this were given this week. We also have started our next novel study The Westing Game. Today students were given their new spelling words. We will work on the Spelling Workout and will have a test on Lesson 18 words on January 31st.
- Geography: We have finished our History. There will be a test on the last few chapters on Monday. The
 Culminating Project is due on the 5th. We have started the first chapter which focuses on landform
 patterns. There will also be map quizzes so students can understand the world better and make
 connections with it.
- Science: We will investigate the properties of various construction materials, learn how to select appropriate materials for manufacturing, conduct structural analysis, and explore ergonomic tools. We will also prepare for the upcoming exam on February 6th by reviewing key concepts. An open book test will take place on January 30th.
- Bible: We have started our next unit on Job and Ecclesiastes. This unit will help us to trust God even when bad things happen. Memory Work Ecclesiastes 3: 1-2
- Art: We have finished our project on 2 point perspectives. We have started our next project which will focus on form and colour using shoes in a style called "pop art"

Next week's focus:

Bible: In the Alpha Youth series, we will learn how God helps us overcome the challenges and negative aspects of our lives.

Memory Verse: Psalm 1:1-6 (Review)

¹Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful.² But his delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law doth he meditate day and night. ³ And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper. ⁴ The ungodly are not so: but are like the chaff which the wind driveth away. ⁵ Therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous. ⁶ For the Lord knoweth the way of the righteous: but the way of the ungodly shall perish.

Mathematics: We will focus on fractions—covering addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. We will also review for the Math Exam, scheduled for February 7th.

Language: We will read Chapters 8, 9, and 10 of *The Giver* and complete the related activities. Additionally, we will cover Spelling Lesson 19 and continue working on writing our speeches.

History: We are concluding our study of Canadian History for Grade Eight. In this final section, we will learn about the extremes of Canadian society at the turn of the 19th century and explore the causes of World War 1. A history study package has been distributed—this mandatory assignment will help with exam preparation. The package is due before the exam on February 6th.

Science: Prepare for the open-book test on the *System* topic on Wednesday, January 29th. We will then begin our new unit on Fluids, covering viscosity and particle theory.

Art: We will continue working on our 4-part artwork.

French

This week in French we have been learning new vocabulary relevant to each grade's unit. We are working on developing fluency in speaking and reviewing strategies to implement while reading.

- **Grade 8** Students created a movie, song, or video review and posted them to our new French blog. Once all the entries have been published, we'll post the link through Class Dojo for you to enjoy. Next week there will be one-to-one interviews with the teacher about their chosen movie, song, or video. On February 4 there will be an end of unit test.
- **Grade 7** Original et génial! This week students identified the characteristics of particular types of magazines as well as the cover of a magazine. They have been asked to begin contemplating which kind of article and magazine they would prefer to create as a culminating project. Next week students will utilise reading strategies to understand dialogues, and implement read-aloud strategies.
- **Grade 6** *Toi et moi!* Next week, in small groups, students will present word clouds they created that represent them. We will read about and discuss eight types of intelligence. Students will practise identifying main ideas and supporting details by answering questions and making inferences.
- **Grade 5** Students will continue their presentations of a weather report about a community in Quebec. Next week students will review seasons, seasonal weather, and seasonal activities in preparation for their final presentation in which they present what people do in a particular season in a particular region of Quebec. We will be reviewing common -er verbs associated with seasonal activities in preparation for the ER verb test on February 6.
- **Grade 4** *Mon robot respectueux!* Next week students will explore how adjectives must agree in gender and number with nouns by designing robots with different coloured body parts. Please begin collecting small cardboard boxes, paper towel rolls, buttons, aluminum foil, etc. for your child to use to construct their model robot.

Grade 3 - Henriette se sauve! This week we have been learning about the types of shops found in a typical rural French town. Next week we'll learn how Henriette felt while hiding all over town. Students will also learn how to ask/answer questions about how each other feels. Ie: As-tu peur? (afraid?) As-tu soif? (thirsty?) As-tu chaud? (hot?) As-tu froid? (cold?) As-tu faim? (hungry?) As-tu mal? (hurt?) J'ai soif. (I have thirst.) Students will learn how the verb 'avoir' (to have) is used in French along with these adjectives.

Grade 1 & 2 - Students will talk and write about what they need to go outside and play a variety of winter sports: hockey, skiing, skating, sledding, making a snowman, making a fort.

Senior Kindergarten - Students will read and write about winter sports they like to play. Students will review vocabulary associated with equipment used to play hockey, skating, skiing, tobogganing, and making a snowman or making a fort.

Junior Kindergarten - Students will practise spelling and writing the winter sport they like to play.
